Academic Achievement

We are a friendly, caring school that provides a balanced curriculum offer that meets the needs of our learners whilst also challenging and inspiring them to strive for an ambitious future.

At Key Stage 3 (Years 7, 8 & 9) our students are taught the full range of National Curriculum subjects.

Students are taught in a range of mixed ability and streamed groups.

At Key Stage 4 (Years 10 & 11) students will select at least 9 courses to follow leading to level 2 qualifications including GCSEs and vocational qualifications.

All students will take GCSEs in the core subjects:

- English Literature and Language
- Maths
- Sciences (students will gain either two GCSEs on the trilogy GCSE course or three GCSEs for the separate sciences)
- Humanities (History, Geography)

In addition to the core subjects, students will also choose from a range of other options these include:

- Spanish
- Technology
- Drama
- Dance
- Music
- Health & Fitness
 Health & Social Care
- Outdoor Learning

We are keen to encourage all students to achieve well and be ambitious for their futures. In addition to a broad range of extracurricular activities, designed to broaden their horizons, students have access to excellent careers and futures advice from the Careers Manager in partnership with the Education Business Partnership (EBP).

Partnership with parents and external agencies is vital to ensure the success of all students. Parents are encouraged to liaise with the tutors so that good communication between home and school is maintained.



Pastoral Care

Student wellbeing is central to our approach at Havant Academy. Students are well supported by an experienced pastoral team who are committed to enabling students to engage positively with their learning.

The pastoral team is made up of dedicated members of staff who work to establish and maintain positive relationships with students and families; supporting them in addressing any concerns and tackling barriers to progress. They work closely with teachers, tutors, the senior team and external agencies so that the support for all students is effectively co-ordinated.

Tutors are key points of contact for parents and, as far as possible, we aim for students to remain with their tutor throughout their time at Havant so that the relationship that they build with their tutor in year 7 has the chance to grow and mature as they move through the school and all students are supported by a tutor who know them and their family really well.

Without a doubt, being a part of the student leadership team has had many perks, but also having our opinions heard and being able to act on them to make a change that is beneficial to all. I highly recommend that anyone passionate about making a change, really considers a role in the team, you won't regret it (student)











Reading

At Havant Academy we believe good reading skills are key for students leading a successful life long after they have left us. We have an ambition to create fluent readers who value reading.


Reading then is a core part of academy life. We have two dedicated reading sessions each day, one during the morning tutor period and one in the afternoon tutor period. During these sessions students will read independently, or with their tutor group allowing them to develop their reading skills.

READING AT HAVANT ACADEMY

We have a large library within the school and students are encouraged to use this as much as possible during both breaks, before and after school. Books can be withdrawn and taken home and we have a wonderful librarian who can support each child to choose the right books.

Years 7, 8 and 9 also have a dedicated reading lesson in the library where they can read their books for a longer period of time. We offer regular opportunities to read in all lessons in every subject.

Some readers take part in individualised reading programmes in order to improve their reading and understanding of key skills.



ACCELERATED READER (YEARS 7, 8 AND 9)

Years 7, 8 and 9 follow Accelerated Reader, a programme that tracks and measures reading ages by quizzing pupils on texts they have read.

Every pupil in Year 7, 8 and 9 will take quizzes on the books they have read (both in school and at home). We keep track of the amount of books and words read and the number of successful quizzes to reward our readers!

Importantly, the AR system allows us to understand our student's reading ages individually so books best suited to their reading development may be chosen.

SORA

SORA is an online library app where students can access e-books and audio books. The app downloads to a device and there are thousands of titles to borrow.

SORA is entirely free (the price is covered by Havant Academy) and it is available for all year groups.



Uniform
