THREE PERFORM


The perform Homebase for Years 10 & 11 focuses on achievement

Denton Community college was designed to support the delivery of a 21st Century curriculum to the young people of Tameside. We have superb sports and performing arts facilities, modern science labs and classrooms fitted with the latest touch screen delivery systems. Whilst our curriculum provides students with the knowledge they require, it also develops key skills such as teamwork and adaptability. Not only does our curriculum build confidence in our students, it strengthens their self-esteem and self-reliance. We encourage all our students to make use of our facilities both within their timetabled lessons and as part of a broader extracurricular experience.

An exciting curriculum

Years 7, 8 & 9

Our Key Stage 3 curriculum is based around the national curriculum. Alongside this we ensure our students develop critical skills and competences that enable them to taking increasing responsibility for the progress of their own learning.

Our curriculum provides students with the opportunity to experience subjects such as art & design, computing, dance drama, English, French, food technology, geography, German, history, mathematics, music, PE, PHSE, product design, RE, science, Spanish and textiles.









Years 10 & 11

The Key Stage 4 curriculum at Denton Community College provides our students with the opportunity to develop their knowledge and skills across a suite of subjects, matched to their interests and aspirations.

In addition to the core subjects of English, mathematics and science the curriculum also includes studies in citizenship, PHSE and RE. Students are then able to complete their suite of subjects from a range of GCSE and vocational courses such as BTECs. These include:

What we offer our students

Denton Community College firmly believes in offering its students a wide range of extra-curricular activities.

Students have the opportunity to join our many sports teams including basketball, volleyball, football, netball and badminton for both boys and girls. In addition to our sporting opportunities we offer a range of clubs and societies across all curriculum areas including art and technology, science, history, geography and computing. Or being a part of our whole school performances whether on stage or behind the scenes. The range of extra-curricular activities we have to offer should appeal to all of our students and support their development and achievement.

Special Educational Needs

To support us in identifying and meeting the needs of all our students, we have a large highly skilled, SEND & Inclusion Team. This team supports the learning of students in lessons and with our bespoke Inclusion area. The team includes:

Students with special needs will be given appropriate and suitable additional help and support. Sometimes this will be in normal lessons or, after consultation with parents/carers, in small groups or with individual tuition.

The College has a Code of Practice for our special needs provision which meets the specific needs of each student. This is in line with the advice given by the Tameside Local Authority on current Government legal requirements.

The College recognises the requirements laid out in the Special Needs and Disabilities Act. A copy of the Accessibility Plan/Disability Equality Scheme is available on request.



Free Breakfast

Magic Breakfast

Denton Community College offers a free breakfast funded by Kellogg's and Family Action to every student.

Our Breakfast Club means no young person should start the day hungry at Denton Community College. Upon arrival in our schoolyard students will be greeted by staff with breakfast items, from bagels & toast to breakfast bars & fruit. Students can help themselves so they can begin lessons on time and ready for learning.









Student Support Team

We ensure that our highly skilled student support team looks after all our students. Our staff are always happy to talk to you, give support and celebrate the achievements of our students. The team includes:

- A Head of Year for each year group. They will stay with their students throughout their five year journey through Denton Community College

Taking pride in your appearance.

All students attending Denton Community College are expected to look smart and take a pride in their appearance during the College day, as well as when travelling to and from school. We operate a dress code which all students are expected to adhere to.

School uniform

- Purple blazer with College logo
- Denton Community College purple tie
- White button shirt or blouse which will allow a tie to be clipped to the collar
- Charcoal grey tailored trousers which are fitted to the waist
- Denton Community College tartan skirt (To the knee)
- Plain black (polishable) low heel shoes
- Optional Item Charcoal grey jumper with a green collar trim or DCC logo
- Optional Item One pair of stud earrings (only one stud in each ear lobe) and one wrist watch

These items are not accepted as part of the Denton Community College uniform:

- Black or light grey trousers or skirts
- Jersey or stretchy trousers or skirts
- Shirts or blouses with a logo
- Sweatshirts or jumpers not identified as uniform
- Trainers (sports branded) or footwear identified as not acceptable
- Visible jewellery in addition to the identified stud earrings and a wrist watch
- Facial or tongue piercings
