The House System

Students are placed into one of four houses; Cygnus, Delphinus, Phoenix or Ursa. These houses are named after constellations and represent the goal that all students at Teddington School should being reaching for the stars and to shine bright.

House competitions run throughout the year, both within subject areas and extra-curricular activities so that we cover a wide range of interests, meaning there is plenty of opportunity to get involved. Our reward system interlinks with our house system. Merits are gained through producing excellent work and showing our school values. Each merit earned counts towards their house total, so pupils can contribute to their house both inside and outside the classroom.

The house system allows students to have a sense of identity within the school, and opens opportunity for developing community spirit, cohesion across year groups and friendly competition. As well as this, the house system also allows pupils to take on leadership roles, including leading their own house competition. We encourage Year 7s to engage with as much house activity as possible to ensure the full Teddington School experience.

Strategic Intent

The ethos at Teddington School, that everything matters at all times, resonates through our curriculum. Our rich and broad curriculum is designed for the students within the school, so that each individual can achieve.

It is essential that the curriculum is organised in such a way that it provides students with the opportunity to learn expected behaviours and be successful in their learning both inside and outside of the classroom, so that we can deliver our mission and aims.



Teaching

Teaching and Learning is delivered through quality first teaching. Our teachers provide advice and guidance, coaching, mentorship, feedback and assessment so that students are supported throughout their time at Teddington.

Teachers have access to personal development planning, skills development and practice, and resources to support them.

Each department plans, delivers and reviews its curriculum – the curriculum lifecycle.

Enhancement days support students to access their curriculum further, through developing skills, knowledge and taking the specifications 'off piste'

Understanding each other's curriculum is a key part of staff training.

Curriculum delivery focuses on PITCH, requiring students to be reflective, curious and have ownership over their progress.

Challenge and high order questioning are constant features of lessons.

Our curriculum gradually builds on the learning experience. It allows for continuity of experiences as the learner progresses and grows.

Extra-curricular opportunities are integral to the whole curriculum offer.

Careers advice and guidance is an integral part of the curriculum offer and is supplemented by an independent third-party provider.

Home Learning

We believe in setting students homework activities to broaden their learning and to expose them to a range of different ideas, questions and concepts. Homework will enable students to enhance their skills and knowledge and develop their independent learning and responsibility.

Microsoft Teams is the virtual learning platform we use as a school. Teachers will set homework and assessments through students' class teams, as well as using them as a space for resource sharing, collaboration and wider reading. Microsoft Teams is accessible via www.office.com or the app available on PC, Mac and all smart phones.









Wellbeing

We know that pupils who have a positive attitude towards their learning will make good progress and be successful. Consequently, instilling all of our pupils with 'growth mind-sets' has become a priority for the school.

The whole person matters at Teddington School. We want all of our pupils to relish challenges, embrace their mistakes as part of the learning process, value the importance of effort, respond carefully to feedback and take inspiration from others. This will help them to achieve, not only with us, but also in their future lives as adults.

By taking a holistic approach to staff and student wellbeing we are creating a community that understands the importance of maintaining a balance between working hard to achieve success, whilst looking after our physical and mental health.

We have dedicated sessions in lessons to address what kind of learners students want to be and how we can positively approach challenges inside and outside the classroom. Enhancement days allows students to delve into a theme relating to their journeys, and how best to approach new experiences.

The Pastoral System

We understand how important it is for your child to settle quickly into secondary school and in order to support that, we work hard on our transition programme. To ensure a smooth transition, we do our best to find out as much as possible about your child by working with our partner primary schools, who provide us with assessment and pastoral information.

The form tutor is one of the most important roles in school and key to providing support and guidance. Students meet with their tutor group each morning, taking part in structured learning activities that focus on their social and emotional development, overall wellbeing, and general literacy. A form tutor's role is central in both caring for students and, crucially, monitoring their progress both academically and socially; encouraging involvement, commitment, and the high standards of work and behaviour we expect at Teddington School. The form tutor is the key point of contact for both students and parents/carers

At Teddington we also have a strong pastoral team who work closely with the tutor team to ensure that all students feel safe and happy in school. They provide a strong network of pastoral care with the core purpose of ensuring that students are happy.

Our School Council works for the benefit of the whole school, enabling students to give constructive ideas for school improvements. Meeting with our Senior Leadership Team, it promotes leadership skills and gives our students a voice that is heard.

Sixth Form

At Teddington, we believe a Sixth Form should run with student ownership at the heart of it. This is your Sixth Form and we continually strive to give you the best academic and social experience we can. Our sixth form community is growing with over 160 students on roll, yet and our teaching remains highly personalised in every subject. Our Sixth Form has achieved outstanding success in the last three years and we are delighted that 38% of our Year 13 leavers this year gained places at Russell Group universities, with one securing a place at Cambridge.

Post 16 Courses

We have a broad ranges of subjects that students can study, and we are able to offer both A Level and BTEC courses. All BTEC courses are Level 3 National Extended Certificate, which is the equivalence in size to 1 A Level. Students also have the opportunity to undertake an EPQ.

Outstanding Support

Individual support and guidance are very important to us. Our comprehensive daily tutor programme includes study skills, mental health awareness, careers education and preparing for life after Sixth Form. Our Year 12s are paired with Year 13s in mixed tutor groups, to enable final year students to share their experiences with those who are new to studying A Levels or BTECs. We also have a dedicated pastoral team who support all our students through any challenging times they may face.



Facilities

The Sixth Form block is based in a standalone block, away from the lower school building, allowing students to create their own community. The block has its own canteen and common room area, along with a dedicated student study centre (SSC) which is open from 7am - 7pm Monday to Friday, to allow students to study in their own time. The SSC is fully equipped with computers, subject resources and internet access. Students have access to the multi-media, sports, music and art suites in the main school. All Sixth Form students are issued with an ID card which gives them more freedom to move around the site, as well as gate access on and off the school premises.



Duke of Edinburgh Award (DofE)

Teddington is a DofE Centre, and in the Sixth Form, students can complete the DofE Gold Award (provided they have fully completed at least a Bronze Award). The Gold expedition is significantly more challenging than Bronze but there is no requirement to do Silver first and students who choose this route invariably make the transition successfully.




Exam Results Summer 2022

GCSE

Teddington's results are in line with the high standards and expectations in progress we have made over the last two years, with grades being awarded at the top GCSE level, in all subjects:

A Level

Year 13 students excelled themselves and once again met our high expectations, with the majority of Year 13 students securing their first choice of university and 38% of students are moving to a Russell Group University. In Year 13, 35% of all A Level entries were graded at A*-A, 64% at A*-B and 81% A*-C. Ten of our students achieved straight A*-A. Our progress score is +0.02. This year we have received an ALPS score of 4 with 1 being the highest you can achieve. This means our performance is within the top 40% of the national benchmark.

ParentPay

Teddington School operates a cashless payment system. ParentPay is our online payment service and enables families to pay for items such as school lunches, school trips and additional school resources. Using a secure website, you can pay online using a credit/debit card. Purchases are paid for by a student card avoiding the necessity to bring any cash into school.

Students receive their cards during their first two days and will be able to use their cards to purchase food at break and lunch, use the library and print.

ParentPay is easy to use and offers the freedom to make payments whenever and wherever you like.

SEND at Teddington

Our intention is that all students make good progress no matter what their starting point or learning need. We have a designated SEND team that work closely with all students and families on the SEND register. Our transition package for any student with an additional need is bespoke and tailor made, often in conjunction with families and primary schools.
