

"Being a mentor for ITT's is a great privilege,

I believe that a mentor has a lot to give as well as a lot to gain, mentoring is a crucial part of how a new teacher is moulded and the mentor has a big role in shaping them.

I enjoy seeing the journey that the trainees go through from their first

day to the day they say goodbye, trainees have a lot to give as well, they bring so much knowledge with them and one of the best ways to instill self confidence in the trainee is collaboration and team teaching, this has taught me so much and made me a better more confident teacher. Trainees can help the department in looking at a class with a new outlook.

Clegg Shield Final


Meadowhead 0-1 Tapton






Y13 Leaver's Briefing
