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About School of the Nations

The School of the Nations is an internationally-oriented institution, licensed by the Government of Macau as a non-profit organisation. It is an English-medium instruction school and serves students from kindergarten through Form 6. The School of the Nations is the first Cambridge International School as well as the first IB World School in Macau S. A. R., China.

Mission and Values

As an integral component of the educational programmes of the Badi Foundation, the School of the Nations is dedicated to nurturing the physical, intellectual and spiritual development of its students, and developing their capabilities to promote the well-being of their families and communities. The context for our work is the recognition that humankind is progressing towards a global civilisation that is just, prosperous, peaceful and united. The school seeks to contribute to this process in the context of the Macau Special Administrative Region through its educational programmes and engagement with the broader community.

Enrolment and Curriculum

At the secondary section of SON, there are about 150 students enrolled in Forms 3 to 6. Students in Forms 3 and 4 take part in Cambridge IGCSE courses. Coursework in the lower forms leads to enrolment in the IB Diploma Programme in Form 5 and Form 6. All students in Form 5 and Form 6 are enrolled in the IB Diploma Programme since 2009. In May 2011, the first cohort of International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme students completed the programme successfully, and has subsequently continued to progress and go from strength to strength.

Extra Curricula Activities

Community service is very important at School of the Nations. Teachers and students are encouraged to get involved with supporting the needs of Macau and the region. Form 5 students take an international service trip every year as part of their Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) requirements for the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme. Teachers at all levels find ways to incorporate service learning into the curriculum with typical activities being blood drives, fundraisers for local charities, tutoring and mentoring younger children, and volunteering at charity events in Macau. Every year, new and exciting community service ideas are implemented to enhance the learning and life experiences of students.

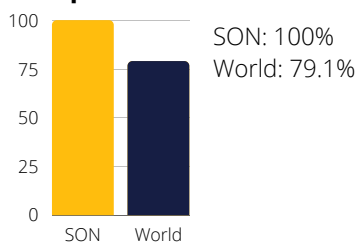

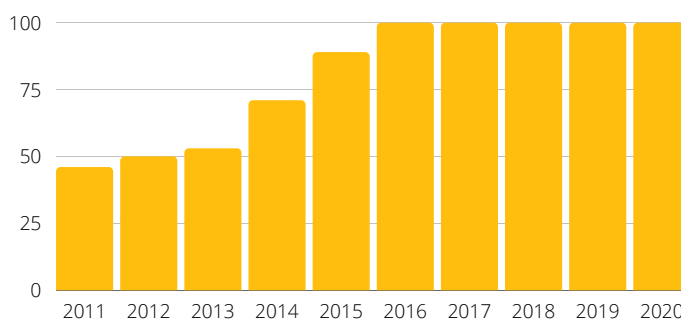

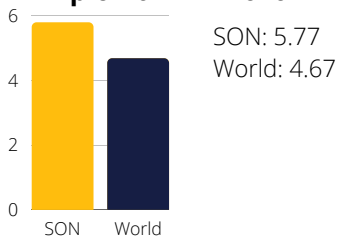
Percentage awarded the IB Diploma MAY 2020



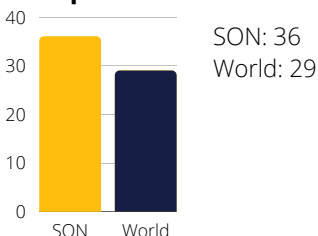
SON IB Diploma Successful Rate (%)



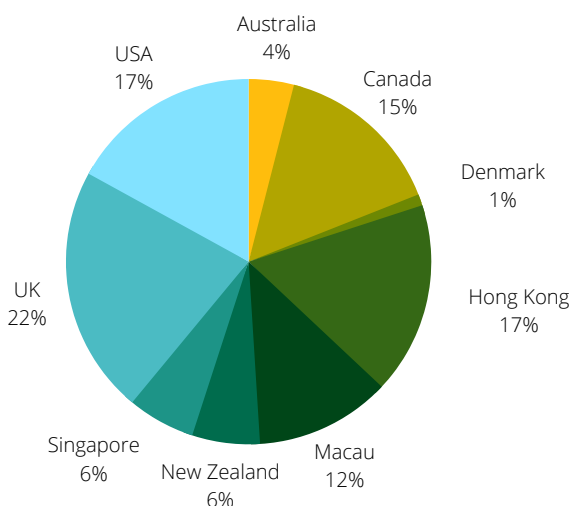
Mean grade of the IB Diploma MAY 2020
