Curriculum

At Somercotes Academy we aim to ensure that the curriculum we deliver provides all students with a broad, rich and deep education which broadens students' minds and raises expectations and aspirations.

The aspirational knowledge-based curriculum is mapped and sequenced to allow the development of knowledge over time to deepen student understanding in each subject. Each unit / topic taught contains specific knowledge that needs to be understood and built upon. Extended reading is championed in all subjects to provide students with the means to enhance and enrich their knowledge. Students are encouraged to make meaningful contributions and to ask questions in order to stretch their own education.

In Year 7, students are placed in bands based on their outcomes at KS2. Throughout each year, there is an opportunity for movement between the bands.

At the Academy, we encourage students to see their education as a journey which began when they started school and will continue with them throughout their lives. By the end of each key stage, knowledge and understanding should be developed with a focus on the needs and aspirations of each student both whilst in education and when they enter the world of employment.



Assessment

At Somercotes Academy we believe that effective target setting significantly raises the attainment of students. Students are set targets that are challenging yet realistic and attainable. These are discussed with students and revised regularly. Targets are based upon Key Stage 2 outcomes and are discussed with students throughout the year.

Somercotes Academy students are frequently assessed to ensure their progress is monitored. Individual guidance and support is given to ensure that all students are kept on track to achieve their full potential.

Regular communication is maintained with parents who receive an annual written report on progress. Assessment Scores are generated three times a year and are issued to students and parents via SIMS Intouch. These scores are holistic grades that reflect the students' classwork and homework, they are not based on a single test or exam. Parents' evenings provide an opportunity for staff and parents to discuss concerns and to highlight student achievements





Pastoral Care

At Somercotes Academy, pastoral care is based on a year group system, supported by the identity of students also being part of a house group.

The Academy is comprised of three houses named after constellations in the night sky – Cetus, Dorado and Volans. Each house is made up of house groups which each have approximately 25 students. Each year group has a Head of Year/House, the house system creates a 'family unit' containing 4 or 5 students from each academic year group. The houses and tutors are supported by the Heads of Year and an Assistant Principal who deals with the whole Academy pastoral concerns. Each house acts as a mini community which gives continuity throughout each student's time at the Academy.

We treat all of our students as individuals and are proud of how we support their personal and academic needs. We expect our students to demonstrate respect for the Academy, for each other and for members of staff. Although pastoral support is focussed through tutors and Heads of Year, all members of staff provide effective care and support. Any member of staff can be approached for help and support by any student who has worries or concerns. The Academy actively seeks the views of student leadership; there is an active student council. The Academy actively seeks the views of students and is committed to providing opportunities for student leadership; there is an active student council.



Extra-Curricular

The Academy offers students access to a wide range of activities outside the classroom. We are proud of the range of sports clubs and teams who represent the Academy and all students are encouraged to participate in sporting activities and events.

There is also a range of music and other subject specific clubs that all students have the opportunity to participate in. The Academy is working in partnership with the Lincolnshire Music Service to provide external music teachers for additional instrumental and singling lessons.

Students have the opportunity to take part in a number of educational visits which support key elements of the curriculum.
