

Supporting our students to aim high

Through academic and pastoral support we are dedicated to ensuring that every student achieves their full potential. Our highly developed pastoral team ensure that students progress towards becoming well-rounded individuals.

We provide dedicated professional staff for students to talk to should they have concerns or worries. In most instances students will approach their Form Tutor, who will be central to their time at the school. The relationship between Form Tutor and student is developed through daily registration and our Personal Development and Citizenship programme. Families have the opportunity to build relationships with their child's tutor through Parents' Evenings, contact by telephone, email, letter or via the student's planner.

We uphold values of respect and pride in our school and in ourselves. We expect students to address members of staff and each other with courtesy and behave impeccably. We aim to establish firm boundaries which students know and understand.

Excellence in our curriculum

Twickenham School prides itself on the broad and balanced curriculum it offers students. We know that the building blocks for success start with English, maths and science. We also know that the wider curriculum grows a love of learning across all subjects. At Twickenham, all students will engage in English, Mathematics, Science, French or German, History, Geography, Religious Studies, Art, Music, Drama, Dance, Physical Education and Computer Programming.

Our curriculum aims to build a curiosity and interest in the world in which we live and prepares students for their next steps in life. High quality inspiring lessons that stretch students, allowing them to explore and explain the world to each other. We will create opportunities for students for collaboration in the classroom, active learning and the development of independent learning skills. Our creative and imaginative teachers will inspire outstanding learning across the school.

We know that to ensure our students are making great progress we need to get teacher assessment, monitoring and evaluation right. ENJOY:

Love of Learning, Wider Opportunities and Enrichment

Twickenham School's enrichment opportunities are truly extensive and offer something for everyone.

We recognise that education is not just about the acquisition of knowledge and skills. A balanced education must encourage students to put their skills to the test and push their physical and mental boundaries. We want our students to enjoy competition, personal challenge and the joy of finding a talent or interest. Sport plays a key part in the success of the School. The PE department aims to achieve both excellence in competitive sport and great fun in recreational sport. All our subjects offer a diverse range of clubs and teams that range from chess to photography and American Football to computer programming. Twickenham prides itself on the wider opportunities for students to take part in a host of educational trips each year, both in the UK and abroad.

Careers education and Work Related Learning is taught across Years 7 to 11 and delivered as part of our Personal Development and Citizenship programme and other areas of the curriculum. Under supervision from our Careers Advisors, all staff are encouraged to consider their role in the 'Twickenham Futures' programme to help students develop the necessary skills to make informed decisions relating to their future. Students have access to group and 1:1 Careers and Work Related Learning interviews & information sessions as well as college and Sixth Form taster days, dedicated workshops to develop intra-personal and communication skills and visits to local employers.

We want all our students to flourish during their time with us. By inspiring wider experiences outside the classroom we know we can help build confidence, self-belief and belonging.



Transition

The transition from primary to secondary school is important in the lives of children and their families. We make the effort to know and understand the needs of every individual. We have developed strong links with our feeder primary schools and we work closely together to maintain this strong partnership.

At Twickenham School, we have a well - established programme of events in place to ensure that every student has a positive experience and is equipped with the tools and emotional resilience to manage a seamless transition.

Our induction programme includes:

- Induction Day
- 1:1 meeting with a member of the Leadership team
- Leadership team visits to the primary schools to discuss pastoral and academic progress of new Year 7 students
- Year 7 transition 'Buddies' – linked to every student in Year 6
- Parents information evening
- Welcome Induction – for students who may need extra support during induction
- Year 7 Tea – Primary teachers return to meet students from previous year to look at progress made in Year 7
