A BRIEF HISTORY



2022

Ulink College of Shanghai started a strategic partnership with Shanghai Jiaotong University and the School of Sciences of Shanghai University to offer more academic enrichment programmes for top performing students.

2019

Ulink College of Shanghai started offering the SABIS programme.

2018

Ulink College of Shanghai was authorized by the International Baccalaureate Organization to start offering the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP).

2015

The Shanghai campus obtained its license from the Ministry of Education to operate independently and changed its name to Ulink College of Shanghai.

2008

The Shanghai campus expanded its capacity and started running the A-Level program in Songjiang District, Shanghai.

2005

By partnering with Shanghai Normal University, Ulink Education established the first center to offer the A-Level program in Eastern China.

2004

Mr. Xun'an Liang founded Ulink Education in Guangzhou and introduced GCSE (General Certificate of Secondary Education) and the A-Level programme to Chinese middle school students.

Operation Center



OUR PEOPLE

A diverse and inclusive community that believes in the power of international education

The school prides itself on the diversity and skill of its teaching force. At present, 80 Chinese teachers and 57 foreign teachers from 21 countries work collaboratively to create an enriching learning experience for our students. Among them, 71.5% hold a master degree or higher. The average teaching experience exceeds 8 years.

Our teachers, who are experts in their fields, are passionate about their subjects and are actively involved in professional development, making them well-equipped to support students . They are never content with simply imparting knowledge but always seek to nurture a love for learning and independent thinking among students by encouraing them to go beyond the confines of the subject syllabuses.

Our Principal

Mr. Liang joined the international education industry in China in 1990 and has devoted himself to preparing Chinese high-schoolers for overseas college education. A true entrepeneur and pioneer of the industry, Mr. Liang's contribution is best evidenced by his effort in bringing IGCSE and A-Level programmes to China and co-founding the first centres to offer such programmes in Guangzhou (the first Ulink College) and Shenzhen (later known as Shenzhen College of International Education).



In 2012, Cambridge Assessment of International Education (CAIE) awarded Mr. Liang and Ulink Education the Outstanding Contribution Award, making him and Ulink the sole recipient of this award in China. According to Mr. Liang, his mission is to explore a type of international education that is best suited to Chinese youth.





CURRICULUM

A Rounded Education Distinguished by Rigor and Balance



International courses such as the ones offered in IGCSE or IB programs not only open doors to elite universities; they also serve as a critical means through which we fulfill our mission statement. By providing access to global curricula and fostering independent learning, we equip students with the skills and knowledge necessary to thrive in world evolving at an unprecedented speed.

Ulink College of Shanghai offers four major international education programmes -- IGCSE, A Level, IB and SABIS - to Chinese national students of 15-19 years old. Depending on which program and track the students choose, the duration of study ranges from two to four years.

As of 2023, the school offers 26 subject courses with English as the main instructional language. The variety of the courses offered has placed UCS at the leading position among international schools in the Eastern China area.

Our students normally take 6-8 subject courses in their first and second year of study and hone in on 4-5 subjects in the final two years. The combination of compulsary and electives not only gives students the freedom to choose a path they are passionate about but also embeds balance and breadth in their development.






A DAY AT ULINK

A good day starts with ULINK







Lunch Break

Morning

• 06.20am

The morning alarm sets off. Students wake up, get dressed and get ready for a day of learning.

Fridays are Casual Days when students are allowed to wear non-uniform clothes.

• 7.20am

Breakfast is served in both canteens. Day students, students living in off-campus and teachers start to arrive on campus.

• 7.45am

First-year students are required to attend a 10-min assembly in their homeroom to get registration taken and take turns to do English presentation exercises.

8.00am

 The first teaching period
 begins, and students attend lessons in designated classrooms according to their timetables.

• 11.20am

Morning periods finish at this time for some students. While some students have lunch in the canteens, others may pick up their deliveries from a designated area.

• 12.10am

The last morning period ends.

Unlike the public schools, where siestas are built into the schedule, Ulink teachers and students follow a schedule closer to their British counterparts.

Everyone has a 50-min lunch break before the afternoon periods begin.

Afternoon

• 14.45pm

Students from the same form class meet with their form tutor at this time every Tuesday to discuss topics of their choice. Our 56 Form Tutors normally organize team-building activities or sharing sessions for the students.

Students from the same year group attend an assembly once a month in which the year leaders lead the reflection on the past month and preparation for the following month.

• 15:35pm

Teaching ends on Tuesdays and Wednesdays at this time, so students may use this period to meet with club members and work on club projects.

Some typical club activities include baseball practices, orchestra rehearsals, documentary screening and more.

• 16.20pm

The last period ends. Day students may go home.

For many students, this is when they relax after a long day of study by participating in group sports, taking a walk or chatting with friends or teachers.

Evening

• 18.30pm

First-year and secondyear students are required to attend evening study sessions inside their homerooms.

On some evenings students attend free lectures, given by guest speakers or faculty, on topics related to mental health, extra-curricular programmes, peer relations. These after-school lectures are another main channel for the school to guide students on personal growth.

• 20.30pm

Evening study session ends. Students clean their homerooms before returning to their dorms.

• 22.00pm

First-year and secondyear students hand in their electronic devices and store them in designated lockers in the dorm.
