What will the KS3 Curriculum look like for Northstowe students?

LITERACY AND NUMERACY

Develop a 'fluent voice' in our students, providing them with a wealth of academic and cultural vocabulary to respond to and express complex ideas and opinions; and prioritising the need for removing literacy and numeracy barriers as quickly as possible so everyone can access, enjoy and achieve in our curriculum.

INSPIRE

Inspire students' curiosity through a broad, balanced and challenging curriculum that is rich in knowledge, multi-cultural capital, and new possibilities; is carefully crafted into a cohesive narrative that builds long-term memory and connections in learning; and satisfies our human desires for problem solving and listening to, and telling stories.

PRACTISE FOR PROGRESS

Focus students' efforts on practising the retrieval of knowledge and the development of mastery concepts (the smaller components that build up to the skills assessed by GCSEs), in order to promote deep understanding within disciplines, and to prepare students for the requirements of KS4.

ACHIEVE

Provide students with boundless opportunities to develop the values, attitudes and attributes that will serve them well in future education, the workplace, and their life; and to celebrate and support their progress and achievement along the way, so they leave KS4 with the best possible qualifications, a wealth of knowledge, a love of learning, and an ambitious plan for their next chapter.



Extra-Curricular

We will provide a breadth of extracurricular opportunities through and beyond the curriculum, creating positive and memorable experiences that includes an entitlement for all students to educational visits.

PLEDGES

The PLEDGES programme is designed to encourage students to develop their character through completing a series of activities in school and reward students who may also challenge themselves in activities and clubs out of school time. It is an award where students are expected to advance by initially 'taking part' in, through to 'organising' and then 'leading' on activities and tasks.

Northstowe Secondary College will create a personalised pathway to enable students to secure experience of the wider world of work before they leave school.


We will provide an extensive CEIAG (Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance) programme which includes work experience, linking with local businesses and mentoring.
