HUMANITIES DEPARTMENT

The Humanities department is one of the largest in the school comprising of History, Geography and Religious Studies. There are currently 9 teaching staff and we are supported by a dedicated admin assistant.

We have seen improvements consistently over the last few years in all three subject and consistently strive to improve the curriculum and our teaching and learning.

Religious Studies

Religious Studies is compulsory for all students.

We study for the AQA Religious Studies GCSE which is completed in Year 10.

Students then have the option to continue their studies by taking the Eduquas Religious Studies A-Level.

History

Uptake at GCSE is large with three classes being taught in most years.

We teach OCR History A-Level with a focus on The Tudor Rebellions, Britain 1930-1997 and the French Revolution.



Geography

We study AQA Geography GCSE and each year visit a beach on the south coast and Bristol City Centre.

An A-Level in Geography is to be instigated in 2022-23.


At the beginning of Lockdown 3.0, Year 8 researched different charities and creative fundraising ideas to help understand the $\,$
