Overview

Danesfield Manor School is a one form entry prep school educating boys and girls from 6 months – 11 years of age. Welcoming families of all faiths and beliefs and promoting an awareness of cultures all around the world with the help of the whole community.

Small class numbers mean pupils really get to know one another well, forming meaningful friendships with children not only in their own year group, but also with children all throughout the school. Staff get to know every pupil well; treating them as if they were their own.

With a broad and balanced curriculum, strong values and growth mindset approach to learning, pupils are empowered with excellent knowledge, extensive vocabulary and innate confidence. A values-based education enriches teaching and learning, allows pupils to achieve beyond their own expectations and prepares them for their life-long journey beyond Danesfield. Pupils learn to tackle challenges using our growth mindset approach; their resilience becomes stronger and their ability to cope with real life situations is another important part of teaching and learning.

Pupils are assessed regularly. Staff identify where and how to support and challenge every child. Pupils demonstrating talent in various subjects are recognised and stretched accordingly. Likewise, the support and strategies to overcome needs is also provided through the Learning Support and Challenge Team.



Aims and Mission

At Danesfield Manor School children receive an education which combines traditional learning with a modern curriculum. We believe that the 'hidden curriculum' - the implicit teaching that develops a child's confidence and self esteem - is vital.

Aims

- To provide a broad, relevant education based on National Curriculum guidelines preparing pupils for the next step in their learning experience, i.e. Foundation Stage to Key Stage 1, Key Stage 1 to 2, Key Stage 2 to 3 - independent or maintained sector.
- To provide a richly stimulating learning environment.
- To foster a learning community which promotes independent learning where all members of the school are actively engaged in developing lively, enquiring minds and a love of learning.
- To provide a welcoming, caring and safe environment, where children can develop self-respect, a sense of individual worth and are able to cooperate with and show consideration to others.
- To develop links with the home, involving families in the life of the school and the education of the pupils.

Mission

Our mission is to educate, to provide experiences in order to help our pupils to excel. We hold education and growth mindset at our core, supporting and nurturing our pupils as they begin their journey through learning and self-discovery.

About Inspired Learning Group

Danesfield Manor School is one of 11 Prep Schools within the group.

The school has a strong values-based culture and a supportive community in which pupils are encouraged to show respect, responsibility and kindness. The curriculum is broad and engaging, combining strong foundations in core subjects with opportunities in areas such as outdoor learning, philosophy, creative subjects and languages, ensuring that pupils experience a well-rounded education.

While the school is already high-achieving and meets all regulatory standards, it has considerable potential for further development and growth. With the support of the Inspired Learning Group (ILG), the new Head will have an excellent platform from which to build on the school's strengths and shape its next phase of development.

The successful candidate will work closely in partnership with ILG while retaining the independence and professional confidence to make decisions in the best interests of the school and its community. The Head reports to the Chief Operating Officer and Finance Director of ILG but enjoys significant autonomy in the day-to-day leadership and educational direction of the school.

Understanding and nurturing this relationship with ILG will be central to maximising the opportunities the role presents. ILG provides strategic guidance, financial stability and operational support, including services such as human resources, talent acquisition and estates management. This structure enables the Head to focus primarily on educational leadership, the quality of teaching and learning, and the continued development of the school's distinctive ethos.

Governance and strategic support are further strengthened through the Advisory Board, chaired by an experienced educational consultant, which provides both challenge and guidance to the Head. In addition, the school benefits from being part of a wider network of ILG Heads who meet regularly to share best practice, exchange ideas and offer professional support.

This combination of strong foundations, supportive governance and strategic backing creates a compelling opportunity for a dynamic leader to build on the school's success and guide Danesfield Manor School through its next stage of growth.

Short and medium term challenges:

- To consider and review the priorities for further development of the School in order to retain and enhance pupil numbers which can assure its future.
- To maintain the profile and reputation of Danesfield Manor School within the community.
- To further enhance the educational offering to pupils from Nursery to Year 6.

Governance and Leadership

The termly Governance meeting is chaired by a member of the Advisory Board with the Director of Operations also present and the Head in attendance, who provides a termly report for discussion.

School Life

Early Years, Nursery and Reception

At Danesfield Manor Nursery, children can join from 6 months old. Staff build successful relationships with pupils across the Early Years Department, helping them as they move on to the next stage of development.

Children can make use of a free flow area to outside learning opportunities and a range of soft play activities.

There is an opportunity for all children who 3+ years old to have weekly swimming sessions with our qualified coach in our on-site heated indoor swimming pool. In addition our Modern Foreign Languages teacher starts to teach Spanish through a programme of song and role play. Music is taught with the children learning about rhythm, tone and different kinds of music. All children have a weekly Forest School session at our local site.

At 4 children join the Reception class where they participate in a full week's programme of foundation stage activities. Staff work with the children to complete the Foundation Stage Profile ready to go into Key Stage 1 when they are 5. Children receive lessons from specialist teachers in Music, Spanish and PE as well as a weekly Forest School session.



The School

Lower Phase

During Lower Phase, children are equipped with the tools and confidence to achieve in all areas of school life. We understand it's important to have fun whilst learning - ensuring there is a strong emphasis on early development of basic skills in reading, writing and maths.

We ensure they develop at their own pace, being nurtured and supported by caring, professional staff. We are proud to have created a culture and framework that enables all children to fulfil their full potential in a happy, positive environment.

The aim of Computing teaching is that learners will be confident and independent in their use of ICT and able to solve problems across the curriculum. We also focus on developing the skills necessary for children to be able to use information in an effective way and to transfer and utilise the skills learnt to other applications



The School

Upper Phase

Building on the solid foundations set in Lower Phase, Upper Phase focuses on developing the eagerness to learn and encourages a spirit of independence. In these years, our aim is to help produce confident and well-rounded individuals, whilst ensuring them the best possible education.

Smaller class sizes ensure that each child gets the highest level of attention – and allows teachers to concentrate fully on the individual child, nurturing confidence and developing self-esteem. This also gives staff the unique opportunity to form unparalleled relationships with the children. Creating a level of support is key in making each pupil feel confident to succeed in all academic areas, and significantly strengthens that important link between



Beyond the Classroom

Clubs and activities

Extra-Curricular Activities take place on a Tuesday each week, for one hour, after lunch. Pupils from Rec-Y6 are put into mixed age groups and take part in various activities around the school with different teachers. The pupils are placed on a rota to ensure they experience as many of the activities as possible, some of the activities that are provided include: play rehearsals, singing, needlecraft, photography, cookery, architecture, board games, sporting activities, gardening and Forest School.

By providing these opportunities for pupils to mix with other pupils across the year groups, pupils are able to develop their confidence socialising with others, they are encouraged to take turns, develop resilience, be creative and question how and why things work – important skills that will undoubtedly benefit pupils for their future.



Trips

All pupils are involved in educational visits from the age of four. These trips effectively link classroom learning to the real world and the wider community.

We see residential trips as an important part of our children's education, encouraging independence and developing trust between teachers and pupils. Trips overseas enable our oldest pupils the opportunity to practise their language skills and explore the cultures and traditions of our neighbours.

Residentials

One of the ways we develop a child's confidence and intelligence is through our annual trip to an outdoor residential activity centre. This is not an optional extra but an essential part of the curriculum which improves children's performance and confidence back in the classroom. Academic intelligence is of paramount importance, but it is just one of the intelligences that needs to be developed if a child is to achieve their full potential.

All the children visit this unique outdoor centre with a series of age appropriate and challenging outdoor experiences. The centre is modern, finished to a high standard and facilitates the children taking part in many different outdoor, educational and adventure activities. Reception class visit for the day, but all other year groups stay overnight building up as they get older. Year 5 get the opportunity to sleep outdoors in tents.

End of school Year 6 trip

Our eldest pupils travel to one of our sister schools in Suffolk, Saint Felix School. They can experience many sporting and beach activities within the safe grounds of a stunning 75 acres of beautiful countryside and on the Suffolk coastline where the school is situated.



The Role

Key aims of the role

- To lead, motivate and develop the school and its staff so that it fulfils the academic, pastoral, spiritual and social needs of the pupils and their parents, by providing an excellent, broad-based education in line with the ethos of the school.
- To work with the Advisory Board, drawing on their experience and expertise, to fulfil all the duties and responsibilities for the proper governance of the school; to ensure that the Chairman and Board receive timely notice and appropriate information on all relevant matters.
- To work closely and cooperatively with the COO, CEO and Finance Officer, in accordance with the Board's strategic direction, in terms of financial matters and site development.

Key responsibilities of the role:

The Head is responsible, directly and by delegation, for

- The leadership and management of the School.
- The care and development of each child and for maintaining excellent academic standards within the School.
- The pastoral care and welfare of all staff and pupils.
- The overall financial performance of the School, for which they will be assisted by the finance team, and for meeting the annual budget agreed.
- Leading, managing, and motivating the Senior Leadership Team and, with them and through them, all academic and support staff.
- The appointment of all staff.
- The assessment, appraisal, guidance, support, and professional development of all teaching staff with the objective of achieving inspirational teaching at all levels.
- The marketing of the School, including fundraising, the production of publicity, literature and any advertising, the public relations profile, management of the School's website and the establishment of positive relations with prospective parents.
- Recruiting a full complement of pupils, and overseeing admission and entrance procedures.
- Planning and implementing an effective curriculum and timetable.
- Planning and implementing the academic organisation of the School, reviewing as appropriate.

The Role

Key responsibilities of the role: (Continued)

- Monitoring pupils' progress and ensuring that parents are provided with regular and appropriate feedback setting realistic expectations.
- Creating the appropriate balance between all areas of school life, extra-curricular activity, and community involvement.
- Maintaining good communications and relationships within the School and with key stakeholders including neighbours, local schools, the local community, and former pupils.
- Developing and maintaining good professional relationships with the parents of pupils.
- Delegating effectively and appropriately to achieve the above.

Working with the Advisory Board

The Head is responsible, directly and by delegation, for:

- Ensuring that the School meets all its legal obligations including compliance with Child Protection, Data Protection and Health and Safety regulations.
- Take overall responsibility for the delivery of excellent pastoral care - ensuring the security and pastoral care of all pupils in line with safeguarding legislation, including safer recruitment and working alongside external agencies as appropriate.
- Implementing policies agreed by the Board and contributing to the vision for the future of the School through strategic leadership and planning.
- Submitting policy proposals for the approval of the Board or assisting the Board in the development of tactical and strategic policies, as well as implementing and monitoring these policies.
- In partnership with the Chair, ensuring that the Board receives sufficient and timely information and advice in order to make informed decisions.
- Implementing Board decisions.
- Preparing and updating the School Development Plan.

The Role

General

- To undertake other duties appropriate to the general purpose of the post, which may from time to time be reasonably assigned by the Chair of the advisory board or the COO.
- To carry out teaching duties as appropriate and time permits.
- To set an example of continuous personal development, participating in appropriate training in order to maintain an up-to-date professional expertise.
- The Head should be aware of trends in education, the requirements of schools and, where appropriate, recommend policy changes to the Board.
- It is expected that the Head will represent the School on sector bodies which the Advisory Board deem suitable.

The Person

Candidates must be genuinely committed to working in an environment where the happiness, wellbeing and safety of the children in our care is central to all that is done.

In addition, good candidates for the role are likely to demonstrate much of the following:

- Senior leadership experience.
- Strong academic credentials and preferably QTS status.
- Understanding of and support for the values and ethos of the School, and commitment to embedding successful all-round education and co-education.
- Inclusive leadership, valuing and promoting the diversity of the community.
- Commitment to delivering top academic, co-curricular and pastoral provision for every pupil, mindful of their wellbeing.
- Natural and easy communication with pupils, staff, parents, prospective parents, the governors and alumni.
- The skills and integrity to win confidence and trust from all stakeholders.
- Ability to articulate and promote the strengths of Danesfield Manor School and raise the profile of the School.
- A strategic and analytical mind with vision but also a degree of pragmatism – ready and able to address the complex political, social and economic issues ahead.
- Change management skills.
- Commitment to partnerships and bursaries – with a strong sense of social responsibility.

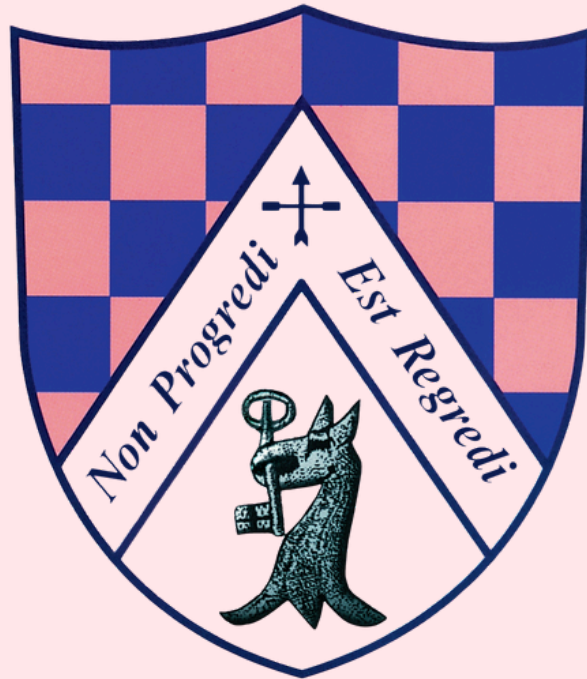
