School Counsellor

At Caterham School we recognise the crucial role that individual wellbeing plays in allowing our pupils to thrive and succeed. We are united in a community-wide, whole school approach to promote wellbeing using proactive, positive and informed interventions to create a nurturing, friendly and ambitious culture. The school has been awarded 'The Wellbeing Award for Schools' demonstrating our commitment to this approach.

The counselling service at Caterham School works as part of the Pastoral team led by the Deputy Head (Pastoral & Wellbeing) which also includes the Designated Safeguarding Lead, Heads of Year, Boarding House Masters and Mistresses and the Health Centre. We currently have one counsellor within this service but, partly owing to the success of our emotional literacy emphasis in the wellbeing programme, are looking to extend the service so that more pupils from across the prep and senior schools can benefit from this type of support.

The successful candidate with work closely with the current counsellor and will meet regularly with her and/or the Deputy Head (Pastoral & Wellbeing).

The Role

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide a high quality confidential counselling service to pupils experiencing a wide range of emotional problems, working within the Code of Ethics and Practice of UKCP / BACP
- Provide support, advice and guidance to pupils, parents, guardians and staff
- Maintain appropriate records, keeping these secure
- Attend supervision with a suitably qualified supervisor
- Meet and discuss specific concerns and general trends with the other counsellor, contributing to a regular report for the Headmaster on the numbers of pupils that are using the service and a general overview of the type of problems being experienced.
- Meet regularly with the Deputy Head (Pastoral & Wellbeing), safeguarding team and Health Centre to ensure, within the agreed boundaries of confidentiality, that any relevant information is passed on to those in school who have pastoral responsibility for pupils
- Establish contacts with personnel from other agencies with a view to easing referrals and accessing specialist consultants
- Communicate with other staff and outside agencies on behalf of pupils accessing the counselling service
- Outline to staff and pupils the role of the counsellor and the boundaries of confidentiality
- Provide consultation to staff whose role it is to

support pupils in distress
