#### The Position

The Commerce and Geography Faculty is a core faculty area at Hunter Valley Grammar School responsible for the teaching of a broad range of courses within the HSIE KLA. The successful applicant would need to be qualified to deliver a range of courses offered by the Commerce and Geography Faculty. Expertise in Stage 6 Geography as well as experience in teaching a combination of Economics, Legal Studies, Business Studies, Stage 5 Commerce and Stage 4 and 5 Geography is required. Experience in teaching Stage 4 History is desirable.

# **Duty statement**

The successful applicant will be responsible in the first instance to the Head of Commerce and Geography. The successful applicant will be required to:

- · teach both junior and senior classes
- contribute to the faculty goals
- promote the faculty by involvement in co-curricular activities
- work as an effective member of a team, demonstrating good interpersonal skills
- be proactive in providing an academically challenging, stimulating and safe environment where students are enthused about the study of subjects within the Commerce and Geography Faculty.

## Criteria for selection

The following criteria will be applied when determining the most suitable applicant.

- It is important that the successful applicant has the capacity to inspire young learners, is a team person and contributes to faculty performance with a demonstrated clarity of purpose, vision and commitment to learning.
- It is important that the successful applicant has had experience in teaching senior HSC courses in NSW schools, or other appropriate systems with noteworthy results.
- It is important that the successful applicant has had experience with the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) requirements as they relate to syllabus demands, programme writing, examination requirements and coaching for HSC performance. Applicants from other systems are required to have had similar experience.
- Experience with the Middle Years' Program (International Baccalaureate), or an extensive knowledge of the MYP, will be regarded as beneficial, however, an excellent teacher who is willing to learn will not be disqualified for not having taught already in a MYP school.
- It is important that the successful applicant values a partnership arrangement with families of the School in seeking the best outcome for each student.
- It is important that the successful applicant have an understanding of and commitment to the Australian Professional Standards for Teachers.
- Applicants should have strong IT skills especially in areas of Web-based activities and be competent in the use of the Microsoft suite of applications. It is preferable that the successful applicant has experience with Moodle or a similar electronic learning system and is able to use electronic resources such as OneNote in the classroom regularly.
- Applicants must be accredited with NESA (or be eligible for accreditation) and hold an appropriate tertiary qualification.

 Applicants should be prepared to make a contribution to the School's co-curricular program and be totally supportive of the values and ethos of this independent grammar school for boys and girls from Pre-school to Year 12.

# Salary and conditions

Salary is paid in keeping with the MEA for Hunter Valley Grammar School.

Teachers at HVGS are required to

- teach 46 x 50 minute lessons in the 60 lesson (two week) cycle
- attend all assemblies
- attend parent/teacher nights, presentation ceremonies and other school functions as determined by the Principal, some which may be outside of school hours.
- participate in the pastoral care programme of the School including taking a mentor group each morning and during pastoral periods
- attend our annual school camps; which generally occur during term time and require nights away from home
- attend our Biennial 2-day staff conference which is held outside of East Maitland
- · support colleagues by taking occasional relief lessons
- contribute to the co-curricular programme of the School
- have an active professional development plan and attend all required PD sessions & staff meetings
- be familiar with OneNote or similar on-line learning platforms
