The PE department at DBS is dedicated and passionate about sport for all and instilling a love for sport for life. Through our PE programme, students experience opportunities to develop skills across a range of disciplines. Our PE curriculum aims to provide every student with the building blocks to develop physically, socially, cognitively, creatively and personally through physical activity, both in school and later in life.

PE lessons are taught in class groups from Early Years 2 through to Year 6 and in form groups from Years 7-9. All students have one PE lesson a week. The PE Learning Journey is concept-based, where students learn important life skills and develop knowledge and understanding, through a variety of different physical activities and sport disciplines. Once students reach Year 9, they will have the option to select PE as an iGCSE for Year 10 and 11. We follow the Cambridge iGCSE course, which involves both practical and theoretical elements.



We are currently working towards introducing the PE A Level course for August 2025, which there is a real appetite for as our students progress through the school.

The PE Department at DBS is flourishing and growing year on year. Our team of dedicated teachers have between them over 80 years of teaching experience. We aim to deliver the highest of quality PE lessons, with student progress at the heart of it. We are constantly reviewing and refining schemes of work and resources, offer and drive Staff CPD and encourage sharing of good practice. This ensures our standards remain high, we are up to date with the current trends in the educational sector and that students are receiving the best possible learning experience in PE.

Swimming is also an essential part of the PE and Sports Department at DBS. We recognise the importance of this physical activity as a life skill. Every student from Early Years 1 through to Year 6 has a Swimming lesson once a week, in addition to their PE lesson. For students in Years 7 and 8, Swimming becomes part of their PE rotation. We have a full time team of dedicated and experienced Swim Coaches who lead our extensive Swimming programme at the school. # Teacher of Physical Education

### The Role

PE at DBS is taught as a specialist subject, and the Teacher of PE is required initially to teach PE up to Year 11 (IGCSE), which will extend to upper years (A Level), as the demand grows. The post holder is responsible and accountable for securing the highest standards of student achievement, specific to the subject, for the students that he or she teaches. This occurs through effective monitoring, evaluation and review of the learning progress and teaching outcomes, and setting targets for improvement.

The Teacher of PE must subscribe fully to the core values of DBS, and understand how academic study, pastoral care and co-curricular activities contribute equally within it. The Teacher of PE will be responsible to the Vice-Principal Academic, through the Director of Sport.

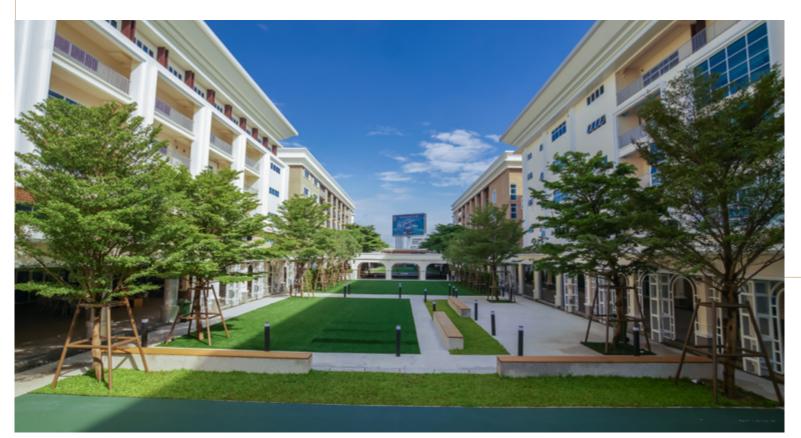
