Modern Foreign Languages at The Carlton Academy

The MFL Faculty is suited in four classrooms, has its own staff work base and has good levels of ICT access within the immediate vicinity. Over the last four years, outcomes in languages have continued to rise, both in Key Stage 3, 4 and 5. All students study two hours of Spanish each week in Years 7 and 8, and targeted students in higher ability sets study an additional hour of French. Students can choose to study French or Spanish in Key Stage 4 (Years 9-11) and both subjects are also on offer at A Level.

The Faculty runs regular enrichment activities, both in school and trips and visits and is now developing exchange programmes with other overseas schools. This is an exciting time to join the MFL team and an opportunity to contribute to its rapid development and further success.
