

Under the guidance of the Director of Learning and Teaching and the Head of Recruitment:

 Be responsible for undertaking administrative and organisational processes across the Trust and liaise with partner schools and external institutions related to the process of applications, recruitment and training of teachers for Creative Education Trust

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Manage manual and computerised records and information
- Undertake word processing and ICT based tasks
- Provide administrative support to schools within the Trust
- Complete and submit forms related to Teacher Training and ensure the Trust is kept up to date with developments
- Contribute towards the planning of events
- Contribute to the overall aims of Creative Education Trust and the development of different routes into Teacher Training
- Establish constructive relationships with all schools and communicate with external providers

- Keep records on trainee's job offers and follow up with all current trainees
