ABOUT OUR SCHOOL

In 1972, Mrs. Beryl Pritchard founded Canterbury School with a vision to make British education accessible to all, thereby opening new opportunities for the Canarian community. Canterbury School began as a modest nursery with just seventeen children taught by Mrs. Pritchard herself. It was the first institution on the island to offer British education to Spanish nationals and has since flourished into the largest English-speaking school in Gran Canaria, now serving over one thousand pupils from pre-nursery to pre-university levels.

Beyond her role at Canterbury School, Mrs. Pritchard's active contributions have strengthened educational ties and enriched the British school community across Spain. Committed to sharing British education, she was one of the first members of the National Association of British Schools in Spain (NABBS), and in 2019, she was honoured with the prestigious 'Medalla de Oro' (Gold Medal) in recognition of her unwavering commitment and positive impact on education in the Canarian community.

Building on this foundation, Canterbury School remains dedicated to fostering a dynamic learning environment that continues to inspire and broaden the opportunities for future generations of pupils. As we move forward, her legacy continues to guide us toward progress, innovation, and a positive impact within the Canarian educational landscape and the broader community of British international schools.





ETHOS AND VALUES

Our vision is to create a unified learning community that inspires all involved to make a difference, through being a school which encourages a culture of “can do”, challenge and care. We develop collaboration through strong relationships and clear communication. We believe in every child’s capacity to learn, and we challenge and support pupils to be independent and confident learners in equal measure.

Our commitment extends beyond academic knowledge and skills; we place a high emphasis on personal, social, and emotional development. We nurture the core values of unity, responsibility, respect, and friendship, ensuring that our pupils grow into well-rounded individuals who will positively contribute to society.

OUR COMMUNITY

A deep sense of community spirit is intrinsic to the Canterbury experience. Relationships across the school are founded on the principles of trust and accountability. We are committed to cultivating a community where bound by mutual care and respect, positive relationships flourish, and the enjoyment of shared experiences is the norm.

This is made possible, in part, by a supportive and engaged network of families. With over thirty nationalities, ranging from Spanish-speaking Canarians to British, Chinese, Indian, Korean, Russian, French, Dutch, Italian, and Canadian, we are fortunate to have a global community with diverse backgrounds that enrich our perspectives and deepen our cultural appreciation.

It's not uncommon for our alumni to enrol their children. This continuity has allowed some of our educators the unique privilege of guiding and inspiring two generations within the same family, fostering a legacy of love for learning in a warm and familial environment.

Our staff comprises of enthusiastic, highly qualified professionals dedicated to fostering and promoting keen learners, understanding the importance of this in helping our pupils grow into motivated individuals. While some of our teachers have recently joined us from the U.K., many are permanent residents, contributing to a balanced mix of fresh perspectives and seasoned experience. Many of our staff members have dedicated significant years of service to Canterbury School, further enriching our community with their wisdom and commitment.





GROUPS AND FACILITIES

At Canterbury School, we are privileged to have prime locations across the island, that enhance our educational mission. Our institution is spread across three distinct sites, housed within five separate buildings.

Our infant department in Las Palmas is situated within the historic and protected Milton House, an architectural gem designed by the renowned Canarian architect Miguel Martín Fernández de la Torre. Nestled in the charming neighbourhood of Ciudad Jardín (Garden City), this distinguished building is a testament to the late 19th-century British settlers who left an indelible mark on the town's economic life and architectural style. Today, Ciudad Jardín stands out in Las Palmas for its unique blend of single-family homes surrounded by gardens, offering an idyllic environment for our youngest learners to flourish.

The San Lorenzo campus, our most extensive, is set against the backdrop of the serene Canarian countryside, just a 15-minute drive from the urban centre. This site, once a banana plantation, now houses the Primary, Secondary, and Sixth Form departments, along with the administrative hub. The campus offers a tranquil setting and specialized amenities, including a theatre, library, art studio, five science labs, three ICT suites, two study areas, sports pavilion, gymnasium, and ample outdoor play areas.



Our infant-primary school in Maspalomas is located in the south of the island. Surrounded by a flourishing mango grove, our school community not only enjoys the natural setting but also gets to savour the mangoes grown on the plantation.

As our pupils from Maspalomas advance to Secondary education, they transition to the San Lorenzo campus in the north. Despite the geographical distance, we foster a unified spirit of learning and community across our campuses. We facilitate excursions between the Primary department at San Lorenzo and the Maspalomas campus, which boasts its own water park. These reciprocal visits enrich the pupils' experience and ease the transition for those moving up from the South.

With one of the most expansive educational infrastructures on the island, we are able to provide a wealth of curriculum opportunities throughout the school and plenty of outdoor spaces in a favourable climate, in which pupils get to enjoy nature and broaden their horizons. Our extensive facilities are a living embodiment of our motto, where **learning** is vibrant, **growth** is nurtured, and every child is given the space to **thrive**.

SECONDARY DEPARTMENT

Our curriculum, based on the English National Curriculum, is adapted to our cultural context. As a British International School, we integrate British values with an international perspective, providing immersion in the English language, while emphasising Spanish language & literature and Canarian culture, as well as studying a third language from Year 7. Our school is accredited to offer both the International Baccalaureate (IB) programme and A-levels, and we serve as an examination centre for IGCSE and International AS/A Levels.

At Key Stage 4, we offer a diverse range of courses preparing students for the IGCSE exams. In addition to the core and elective subjects, our students study Spanish language & literature and social studies, as required by the Spanish educational system for ESO recognition. We help students select subjects that align with their interests and strengths through personalized tutor sessions, informative meetings with parents and an Options Fair.

At Key Stage 5, we deliver an education based on the content and skills of the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme (DP), designed to achieve high academic competence within a holistic curriculum that promotes research, social, communication, self-management, and thinking skills. We are the only school on the islands that offers the IB Diploma Programme in English. Additionally, we run an induction programme for Year 12 students and a career orientation week filled with activities, events, visits, and workshops. These are designed to offer support, guidance, and opportunities for personal, academic, and social development.



To stay current with international standards and prepare students for higher education, we embrace innovations in teaching and learning, particularly through the use of technology. Our curriculum is supported and enhanced by digital learning technologies, aiming to create responsible digital citizens. We use online platforms to support our students' learning, ensuring they have access to a wide range of resources and tools. We emphasise the importance of high-quality, relevant homework in student achievement, providing carefully planned assignments that challenge students to work independently. All homework assignments are posted on our online platforms, making them easily accessible.

Canterbury students consistently achieve good results that exceed national averages. Since Outstanding Cambridge Learner Awards were first introduced in 2007, our students have consistently received awards for both GCSE and A-levels. The vast majority of our students move on to higher education, with 80% achieving their first-choice university. Throughout the years, our students have gained places at prestigious universities such as Russell Group universities, including Oxbridge and Imperial College, Delft, Trinity College Dublin, Sciences Po, Complutense University of Madrid, and Ecole Hoteliere de Lausanne, amongst many others.





PRE- UNIVERSITY

As an international school, we have a track record of sending students all over the world, including Spain, the Netherlands, UK, Ireland, Germany, France, Switzerland and USA. We support our students in making these decisions by providing them with information and exposure to relevant degrees and universities based on their individual profiles and objectives. We offer individual counselling from experienced staff, visits to career and university fairs, and both local and international visits to universities through our annual university tour abroad.

To support them in achieving their goals, students are encouraged to take increasing responsibility for their lives and prepare for life beyond school. We offer a wealth of leadership and extra-curricular opportunities with our non-academic programmes.

During the last quarter of the Y11 course, students participate in an educational internship programme in companies that provides first contact with the professional world. Students may continue with the Educational Internships programme in June of Y12 making it part of the CAS programme in which they need to undertake three strands: creativity, activity, and service over a period of 18 months.

POWERED BY STUDENTS FOR STUDENTS

We look to our Sixth Form students to set a strong example by taking on positions of responsibility and leadership. The Canterbury Student Union (CSU), comprised of VI Form students, is led by our Head Girl & Head Boy and their corresponding deputies. The CSU operates with an annual budget and coordinates its efforts through a structured organisation that includes departments of administration, finance, activities and events, design and communication, and space improvement. This structure allows them to effectively contribute to school decisions and have a high level of impact on the school community. This dynamic team provides students with emotional, personal, and academic support, coordinates activities and events throughout the year, fosters a strong sense of community, and consistently enhances the student experience.





LIVING IN GRAN CANARIA

Las Palmas de Gran Canaria, the capital of the Canary Islands, is a city that embodies vibrancy and vitality.
