The Role




The Stamford Endowed Schools are looking to appoint a well-qualified, inspirational part-time Teacher of English as an Additional Language (EAL) to join a busy and successful department.

The post is for 0.2 FTE however there is a possibility that this will increase from September 2021. The successful candidate will be an experienced, committed and enthusiastic teacher who possesses the ability to teach at all levels. The ability to speak Cantonese and/or Mandarin would be advantageous.

As a teacher of EAL you would be assessing our EAL students and teaching those students who require either an English-language qualification or language support. You would also be involved in liaising with colleagues as to the needs of those students and as to how best to support them.









The Department



The EAL (English as an Additional Language) Department is a busy, friendly and small department committed to the well-being of its students and to supporting this group of individuals academically, intellectually, socially and pastorally.

The Department has the role of assessing our EAL students and of teaching those students who require either an English-language qualification or language support. It is also closely involved in liaising with colleagues as to the needs of those students and as to how best to support them.

Most of the students at SES who require EAL tuition are from overseas, principally from Europe or China, although there is a minority of students whose families have settled in the UK or who are British citizens with a home language or first language other than English. The majority of EAL students at SES are boarders. Since our students attend both Stamford High School and Stamford School, teaching takes place on both sites.

Our overseas students begin their careers at the Stamford Endowed Schools at any time (including during primary school). However, the principal years of entry are Y9, Y10 and Y12. In general, our students go on to pursue a degree in an English-speaking country. This means that while the Department supports the development of their social and general English, the development of their academic English is a high priority.

Some EAL students, depending on the level of their English, will have English language lessons instead of pursuing a modern foreign language course in Years 7 to 9, after which they may follow a course leading to the IGCSE in English as a Second Language. If their English is judged sufficiently developed, they will take the First Language GCSE, often with some EAL lessons to support them. Currently those students who follow the second language course are prepared for the Cambridge International Assessment Examinations 0991 examination but the Department will be introducing a new IGCSE from September 2021. The CAIE course comprises reading and writing, listening and speaking examinations. Speaking is examined and marked by the teacher but externally moderated.

In the Sixth Form students who do not have an English qualification which will allow them to continue to an English-speaking university are prepared for the Academic IELTS examination. These lessons take place once or twice a week depending on student need and availability. The most able students may be allowed to prepare through self-study. Currently the department consists of one full-time and one part-time EAL teacher. To meet the needs of our students we are looking for an EAL part-time teacher.
