The Department

Caterham School has an excellent reputation as a netball playing school and intends to appoint an inspirational Director of Netball to build on the success we have enjoyed over recent years. The role of the Director of Netball will be to drive the development of Netball as innovatively as possible across the school, encouraging maximum participation, enthusiasm and breadth of opportunity. It will also be essential to create an inclusive coaching structure which engages with all abilities and supports high performance athletes. In addition, the Director of Netball will have strategic oversight of the development of the Caterham School Netball Academy which has a growing reputation as a centre of excellence, with strong links and pathways through to regional and national representation.

The successful candidate will also have the opportunity to be coach of the Surrey Storm Academy at Caterham School, which is the first tier of the Performance Pathway. Surrey Storm are the leading netball franchise in the South East and one of the leading franchises in the country.

HOURS OF WORK

This is a full time, year around role with 5 weeks paid annual leave plus bank holidays. It is expected that more hours will be required in the September to April season than in May to August but hours will be an average of 40 per week. It is expected that 6 weeks of the School holiday periods will be working weeks for school holiday camps.

Working hours will include some evenings and weekends.

The Role

SUMMARY OF RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES

School

- Deliver hands-on coaching of all abilities and provide specialist coaching clinics for players across all age groups.
- To work closely with the Director of Sport and Assistant Directors of Sport to develop a strategy for taking netball at the School to an even higher level.
- Enhance the reputation of the School for fair play, good behaviour and hospitality;
- Maintain and enhance the current standing of Caterham in the Schools' game;
- Continually evaluate the success of the Netball Programme;
- Induct new coaches with regard to practice times, matches, facilities and equipment and the expectations with regard to standards of discipline, performance, kit, health and safety, risk and hazard assessment, and hospitality;
- Keep updated, and preferably one step ahead of the opposition, in all aspects of training, coaching, umpiring and playing;
- Make sure that the school has the necessary equipment for netball;
- Manage the netball budget as agreed with the Director of Sport and Bursar;
- Administer appropriate procedures as and when required, particularly with regards to the recording of injuries in both training and matches;
- Review the netball section of the Caterham Sport Development Plan and Coaching Handbook and implement changes as and when required;
- Review Health and Safety procedures and implement changes as and when required;
- Liaise with the Health Centre to ensure medical supervision of all matches;
- Prepare players for Representative Honours;
- Oversee the ordering of playing kit for each season;



The Role (continued)

- Communicate with the Director of Sport when clashes regarding demands on a particular player's time occurs;
- Organise regular tours, both domestic and international.
- Create and manage a balanced fixture list for girls' games.
- Liaise with colleagues in other areas the School to ensure catering and transport requirements are in place for the sporting fixtures and events you organise.
- Enter all fixtures into SOCS organise transport to fixtures;
- To liaise with the Principal Deputy Head regarding 'out of class' requirements, having tried to minimise this whilst at the same time producing a balanced fixture list;
- Celebrate the school's netball successes and use it as a vehicle to market the school effectively using outlets such as Twitter and Instagram;
- To confirm all matches and arrangements at least one week in advance and communicate the details to the following stakeholders; staff, Reception, Health Centre, Ground Staff, Website, www.caterhamschoolsport.com, Director of Co-Curricular, Senior Deputy Head;
- To act as the technical coach (netball expert) for Caterham School teams as well as being involved in taking a variety of age group training sessions and fixtures throughout the Autumn and Spring Terms;
- To inspire pupils of all abilities and also respecting and valuing the different experiences, ideas and backgrounds others can bring to the development of team and individual capability.
- Any other duties that fall within the reasonable scope of the role as requested by the Director of Sport.



The Role (continued)

Netball Academy

- To report to the Surrey Storm Performance Pathway Manager and help to deliver Surrey Storm's goals for the Surrey Storm Academy at Caterham School.
- To coach the Surrey Storm Performance Pathway players one evening per week and undertake the administration to support this coaching.
- To develop junior and youth netball in the East Surrey, Croydon, West Kent and South East region through weekly coaching evenings and school holiday camps held at Caterham School.
- To undertake the necessary administrative tasks and marketing to make evening and holiday coaching activities successful. To coach at local prep schools and junior schools where this can be dovetailed effectively with Caterham School coaching. At all times, be a positive ambassador for Caterham School.
- To actively promote netball umpiring and coaching awards using Caterham School as a centre for coach and umpire development.
- To develop a strong brand for the Caterham School Netball Academy.
- To agree and meet annual net income targets for the Netball Academy in conjunction with the School's commercial activity plans.
- To work collaboratively and supportively with colleagues within the School, Surrey Storm, and with colleagues in other organisations.

Community Outreach

- Work collaboratively with other academy managers at Caterham School and the Senior Teacher (Social Responsibility & Engagement) to promote the community outreach programme and encourage participation in Academy events and activities with an aim of getting more children, from all backgrounds, playing netball.

- An ability to engender an inclusive ethos in Netball, whilst recognising and catering for exceptional performance.
- An ability to support and advise the staff who teach Netball and mentor them to develop as coaches.
- An ability to maintain the profile of Netball both within the School and beyond.
- An experienced leader, able to command respect from his/her peers, the children and the parents.
- Forward-looking, dynamic and strategic in outlook, with the ability to generate ideas and drive change
- A strong communicator and a good listener able to engage with staff.
- A strong sporting background, with proven experience and expertise in the coaching and management of Netball.
- An individual who possesses charisma, enthusiasm and ambition.
- A motivated individual able to work on own initiative.
- A reliable and enthusiastic individual with a flexible approach to work.

- Experience of playing or coaching netball at a high level is essential.

EXPERIENCE

- Proven record of sports development.
- Working in a team environment, planning and delivering practice sessions.
- Working in a one to one basis by building relationships and trust between player and coach.
- Working with schools, planning and delivering sessions for groups of children.
- Delivering courses for various age groups, continually looking to progress their skills.
- Ability to deliver inset days to teachers and provide coach education.

QUALIFICATIONS

- It is essential to have Netball Level 2 Qualification or similar.
- A Netball Level 3 Qualification would be a distinct advantage as well as relevant playing and/or coaching experience.
